Even though December was only the 4th month of the school year, the school grew by +55 (5.5 months) in math and +77 (7.7 months) in language arts over the semester. They spent the last two weeks working on algebra and writing strategies. You may think, "How would kindergarteners even begin to work on such things?" The first step is conceptual, challenging students to find the unknown shape in a pattern. Language arts is a bit more difficult as they do not have specific kindergarten standards, but there are lots of second grade standards they are capable of mastering. An example may read as follows: Revise the sentence to use a stronger verb. They know that joyful is a stronger adjective than happy, and it is a closer synonym than silly, so they pick joyful! ~ Mrs. Fynaardt
