- From the Bus Committee, an issue with getting the registration paper for one of the buses has been resolved.



#### STO Tax Credits

School Tuition Organization Tax Credits available until are still December 31. #### Heartland Conference



On October 7 & 8, seven of our teachers attended the Heartland Conference at Dordt College, in Sioux Center. Each of them gave us a brief glimpse into the value of the conference.

#### Miss Erica Taft

One of the sessions I attended was given by Jean Thomas Siouxland Christian School about science. She is a kindergarten teacher and tries to make science as interactive as possible. In the session, she gave many ideas and examples on how we can make our own science class more interactive and engaging. I plan to slowly integrating ideas, and others, in my own science classes. My end goal will be every science unit having an experiment or interactive component that may not have been previously.

#### Mrs. Melinda Vos

Shalom tends to be synonymous with peace, but that is not a complete understanding. Shalom is peace, wholeness, restoration, and everythingmade-right. It is that feeling of longing in the Christian's heart for the return of Christ when all will be made right again. Jim McKenzie from Gainesville, Florida explained how their school has started taking the concept of Shalom and rethinking all their curriculum through the lens of Shalom. What does Shalom with God look like? What does Shalom with others look like? What Shalom creation with like? And what does Shalom with ourselves look like? To answer each of these questions they look at what knowledge, skills, and attitudes need to be cultivated to bring about a greater level of Shalom within the school and within each student. And it is when students move towards greater Shalom that greater flourishing can happen in all areas of their lives.

What a blessing it was to be able to attend the Heartland Convention at Dordt University. Brainstorming and learning from other Christian educators is a treat, and I was even able to visit with some of my past college classmates, past teachers, and new friends.

One session I went to was led by my cousin, Heidi Douma. The session focused on community and collaboration, and how we all need to work together for the students. She challenged us to listen, speak clearly, always follow through, step up to help, be kind, and to tell others "thank you". Another session that I really enjoyed was about the classroom climate led by Karen Christians. What is a climate builder in the classroom and what is a climate buster? She encouraged us to be honest with ourselves about our failures and to learn from them.

It was a wonderful time of growth and collaboration. We had the opportunity to sing together too, a real treat to raise our voices together in praise to our Creator. A big thank you to the board for allowing us to attend the conference.

This year the State of Iowa has again given the Legacy of Grace School Tuition Organization (LOG-STO) an opportunity to raise \$413,264 for tuition assistance.

LOG-STO is in its 15th year of existence. Our purpose is to raise funds to provide scholarships for eligible students to attend a Christian school, For 2021 the State of lowa gives a 75% tax credit on all donations to this great cause. LOG-STO is proving to be extremely beneficial in its effort to help families be able to afford a Christian education for their families.

Fortunately, in 2020 we were able to collect the full amount to fill our state allotment of credits. The families representing LOG-STO have one of the highest eligibility rates for receiving tuition grants for Christian education in the whole state of Iowa. This means the families that send their children to our schools are sacrificing much and are extremely dedicated to providing a Christ-centered education for their children. We praise God and thank you for your continued support.

On the backside of this letter there is a donation form. We encourage you to visit with your tax preparer and ask them about the **School Tuition Organization Tax Credit** to consider the potential of how this program may benefit you by reducing your tax liability. You can also increase the 75% benefit of your gift by donating stock, grain, and any possible Required Mandatory Distributions (RMDs) if you are at least 72 years of age. Please call me or your school's STO representative to better understand one of these options. I also ask you to pray and seek God's guidance in this matter to help us meet this year's needed funds. Thank you for your consideration!

I want to emphasize that your gifts should not replace the present giving that you do for Christian education.
