The kindergarten and first graders only have positive reinforcements with stickers and dojo points if they master their objective. Grades three through eight receive both. Their positive reinforcement includes classroom cash, dojo points, and coupons. Their negative reinforcements are a loss of those rewards and some recess. After implementing these things upon my return, the school as a whole has grown +32 (3.2 months) since the beginning of the year in both math and language arts. A quote from Booker T. Washington is "In all things that are purely social we can be as separate as the fingers, yet one as the hand in all things essential to mutual progress." (*Up From Slavery*, p.117) Booker was a very determined and kind person so we, as a class, decided to put a compliment box in the hallway. We encourage anyone to write a nice compliment to someone.
