



Principal's Message Looking for New Teachers

I think most of our society knows by now that we are looking for two new teachers. We are looking to fill 1st/2nd grade right now and 5th/6th grade for next school year. We know that God will send those candidates in His timing, but I wanted to relay what it is like to teach at Peoria Christian School. So, if you have been praying about applying or know someone that is looking for a teaching position, please pass this along to them.



- 1. Our small class sizes that we have. God has blessed us to allow our teachers to individualize lessons to help meet the needs of every student.
- 2. We are like a family.
- 3. Our 1:1 technology (I-pads for kindergarten-2nd grade and Chromebooks for 3rd-8th grade)
- 4. Our brand-new touch boards in every class
- 5. There are so many more reasons why you would want to apply to teach at Peoria Christian School, but the number one reason is that teachers are able and expected to teach from a reformed Biblical perspective every single day. However, what does that look like? Here are some actual examples of objectives that we use in Math:
 - I can describe God's covenants with a triangle.
 - I can use God's law for adding and subtracting integers to simplify expressions.
 - I can describe God's design of a circle.
 - I can see God's order when counting numbers on a number line.

I chose to include some examples in Math because people seem to think that teaching Math from a Biblical perspective is difficult, but I would disagree. Think about all of the ways God has designed shapes and all the covenants He has with them. Think about all His laws He has with the formulas. It is so exciting to be able to teach Math from a Biblical perspective.

Here are some objectives in Reading/Grammar that we teach:

- I can understand God's design of a sentence.
- I can identify characteristics that God has designed for a biography.

Here are some objectives in Science that we teach:

- I can understand God's covenant with gravity.
- I can defend a young earth stance from a Biblical perspective.

Here are some objectives in History that we teach:

- I can explain what God accomplished through the life of George Washington in the Revolutionary War.
- I can explain how God shaped Abraham Lincoln's life to prepare for leading a country through crises.

These are just a few of the examples, but I hope these are encouraging you to consider teaching at Peoria Christian School.
