

Christian Education: How God Intended It

This past week, we just finished celebrating Christian education. We had two chapels, one led by Mr. Jim Warden and one led by Mr. Al Bandstra, we had a Science Fair, we visited Independence Village, and concluded the week with Grandparent Day and a concert, where our students showcased their gifts and talents that God gave to them. It was a very tiring week but very rewarding at the same time, in which we hopefully did everything to glorify God (I Corinthians 10:31). I definitely am glad we specifically take time to celebrate Christian education.

I'm sure you have heard that Christian education is just simply public school that includes prayer and chapel. I'm sure you have heard that Christian education is just simply a way not to have your kids learn about evolution. I want to clarify that we do teach that God created the Heavens and the earth, we teach that God did it in 6 literal days, we also have prayer and chapel; however, God intended Christian education to be so much more. In Genesis 1:31, the Bible says, "God created everything and it was very good (Genesis 1:31)." This includes Math, Logic, Reading, Science, and all the different subjects. I think that it is important that we emphasize that there is no such thing as neutrality in the Christian language. So, when we say we teach from a Biblical perspective, it is not just trying to avoid teaching certain items, but teaching subjects how God intended them.

You might have heard about teaching from a Biblical perspective, but what does that look like. One of the many ways that Christian education looks differently is through how we teach objectives. Here are some samples of how our school concentrates on using Christian objectives compared to how it would look through a neutral perspective.

Institutional Objectives:

- 1. I can identify the shape of a triangle.
- 2. I can add and subtract integers to simplify expressions.
- 3. I can understand the design of a circle.
- 4. I can identify the subject and predicate of a sentence.
- 5. I can identify characteristics of a biography.
- 6. I can explain how George Washington led the Continental Army during the Revolutionary War.
- 7. I can understand the rules of gravity.

Christian Objectives:

- 1. I can describe God's covenants with a triangle.
- 2. I can use God's law for adding and subtracting integers to simplify expressions.
- 3. I can describe God's design of a circle.
- 4. I can understand God's design of a sentence.
- 5. I can identify characteristics that God has designed for a biography.
- 6. I can explain what God accomplished through the life of George Washington in the Revolutionary War.
- 7. I can understand God's covenant with gravity.
