



Principal's Message

Isaiah 55:8-9

This year's theme is based upon Isaiah 55:8-9, which says, "For My thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways My ways, declares the Lord. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are My ways higher than your ways and My thoughts than your thoughts" (Isaiah 55:8-9). During this school year, we hope to understand more about this verse.



During chapel on the first day of school, Mr. Al Bandstra spoke and did an excellent job trying to help us understand the meaning of this verse. As humans made in the image of God, we try to understand God's providential plans; however, because of sin and our human nature we sometimes think our ways our better. We start to get impatient and may even start to complain while trying to make it on our own. This can be difficult for adults to understand let alone students.

There are many examples in the Word of God where people thought their ways were better than God's ways, but I want to look at one specific example in John 11. This is where Jesus and the disciples received word from a messenger that Lazarus was sick and then proceeded to wait two more days before making the journey to Bethany. Many questions come from this passage of Scripture, but one question immediately comes to mind: why did Jesus wait two more days before going to Bethany when He found out that Lazarus was sick? We also see Mary and Martha thinking their ways were better than God's ways. In John 11:21, Martha says, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died." Then Mary says the same thing in John 11:32, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died." Both sisters were upset and in despair over their brother Lazarus dying, but we know that God's

way is perfect (Psalm 18:30) and His ways our higher than our ways (Isaiah 55:8-9). He was able to raise Lazarus back from the dead and show His glory, His power, and His love to the world.

- Spencer Fynaardt and Dennis Veenstra plan to visit school this month.
