

Principal's Message Christian School

I was recently asked, "What makes a school a Christian school?" With God's help, hopefully, I was able to answer that person's question, but it got me thinking that others may have the same question. At Peoria Christian School, here is what we try to do to be a Christian school:

- 1. Do everything to glorify God (I Corinthians 10:31)
- 2. Pray (including praying for and praying with each student) (Colossians 1:9-11)
- 3. Personally, disciple each student (Colossians 1:9-11)
- 4. Teach each class from a Reformed Christian perspective
- 5. Have Christian objectives to start each class. Here are some examples:
 - a. I can defend a young earth viewpoint from a Biblical perspective.
 - b. I can use God's law for adding and subtracting fractions.

There are so many other ways as well; however, I think the best way to show what makes a school a Christian school is to share some examples of actual student responses. Here are some examples:

- 1. Question: What is the structure of a sentence? Student Answer: "God's law for a sentence is that it will always have a subject and a verb. God designed the sentence to always start with a capital letter and end with punctuation." (submitted by Rachel Vander Wilt and Macy Van Der Hart)
- 2. Question: What is a polygon? Student answer: "God created a polygon to be a closed, flat shape, with straight sides." (submitted by Josie Hol and Quinten Veenstra)
- 3. Question: Was there enough room on the ark for all of the animals? Student answer: "We know that there was plenty of room on the ark. The design of the ark was thought out by God and given to Noah. God gave Noah the wisdom to know how to build the ark so that there was plenty of room for all of the animals along with the eight people." (submitted by Ashlyn Ver Meer and Cayla Rozenboom)
- 4. Question: How would you define gravity? Student answer: God's covenant with gravity is that it is a force that pulls someone or something to the earth. If you drop a pen when you are standing, then God's law is that the pen will fall to the ground. Objects always fall at 9.8 m/s/s." (submitted by Hannah Van Wyk and Maria Meinders) Another student answer: God's covenant with gravity is that what goes up must come down. Another covenant God has with gravity is that once you let go of an object, it starts to fall. The object will always fall at 9.8 m/s/s." (submitted by Gerrit Meinders, Quinten Veenstra, and Ethan Klaasen)
- 5. Question: Who was George Washington? Student answer: God made George Washington to be the first president. God used his life in many ways. One of the many ways God used George Washington was to free the colonies in the Revolutionary War." (submitted by Ashlyn Ver Meer and Cayla Rozenboom)

As we can see by these responses from our students, the goal of Christian education is train up our children to think Biblically and answer questions that would keep God at the center for His glory and pleasure. Thank you for your continued support, Jeremy Copenhaver
