

# Principal's Message

### **New School Year**

Welcome back! I hope everyone had a fun and exciting summer making all kinds of lasting memories with your friends and family. I know for most people it is bittersweet when the school year starts back up. It is always so fun and exciting during the summer, but kids are also excited to see their friends and basically enjoy the social part of school. For my family, there was a lot of Little League baseball games, vacation Bible schools, and going on vacation to central Pennsylvania. Some of the highlights from the trip were going swimming in my sister's brand new in ground pool, visiting with my mom, going to Hershey Park and Chocolate World, and watching a Philadelphia Phillies baseball game. Then on the way back to lowa, we stopped at the Ark Encounter and Creation Museum in Kentucky for a teacher's conference. It was such an incredible learning experience. The biggest highlight from the conference was the sessions on why defend a young earth viewpoint. This is something our school takes a big stance on and so it was so refreshing and exciting learning from experts in the field. Dr. Andrew Snelling and Dr. Terry Mortenson lead most of the sessions and here were the biggest takeaways on why defend a young earth viewpoint:

- The meaning of Yôm (day) in the Old Testament. When Yôm is modified by a number or when the words morning and evening are used, together with Yôm, it is always referring to a 24-hour period. In fact, outside of Genesis chapter 1, Yôm plus a number is used 410 times and when evening and morning are used with Yôm (23 times) it is always referring to a 24-hour period.
- 2. Until the late 1700s and early to mid-1800s, the church almost universally believed in a young earth viewpoint. It wasn't until James Hutton (1795), George Cuvier (1812), and Charles Lyell (1830), who were claimed deists, who started the idea of millions of years. They had the ideas of nature is all that exists, everything can be explained by time, chance, and the laws of nature, and processes of geological change have always been operating in the past at the same rate as in the present. They thought that the present is the key to the past. It was Charles Darwin then that read and used the works of these men for his evolution framework.
- 3. Jesus spoke of man being created at the beginning of creation instead of millions of years later. Example: Mark 10:6 says, "But from the beginning of creation, 'God made them male and female'". Also, Isaiah tells us that God meant for the world to be inhabited not without people for millions of years. "For thus says the Lord, who created the heavens (He is God!), who formed the earth and made it (He established it; He did not create it empty, He formed it to be inhabited!): 'I am the Lord, and there is no other'" (Isaiah 45:18).

There are so many others, but the last one I will mention, is if you believe in millions of years how do you explain death, disease, and suffering prior to the fall.

Does a young earth viewpoint matter? Well, at Peoria Christian School we teach how and why we should defend a young earth viewpoint and unlike James Hutton who taught that the present is key to the past, we teach that the Bible is key to the past and the present.
