

Príncípal's Message

Continuing Christian Education

I feel that Isaiah chapter 6 really sums up what we are trying to teach every day at Peoria Christian School. The background going into Isaiah chapter 6 is that we learn that Isaiah is warning the nation of Judah of coming judgment, but they lean on their king Uzziah for comfort. However, we learn that Uzziah died suddenly after 52 years of being their king. Uzziah entered the temple and offered incense on the alter, which only the priest could do. He died on the spot (II Chronicles 26:16). The people of Judah were left in shambles. People (including Isaiah) were wondering what was going on and was God still in control.

Well, the very first verse in Isaiah chapter 6 answers that question. It says, "In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting upon a throne, high and lifted up; and the train of His robe filled the temple." The very first thing that Isaiah saw was God sitting on the throne. Isaiah was reassured that God is still ruler, He is still in control, and He is sovereign over all of creation.

In verse 2 it says, "Above Him stood the seraphim. Each had six wings: with two He covered His face, and with two He covered His feet, and with two He flew." We see that God is powerful. He still had His angelic force ready at His command. The angels had 6 wings, 2 to cover their faces as created beings in the presence of a Holy God, 2 wings to cover their feet because they were on holy ground, and 2 wings to fly because they were ready to serve a mighty God.

Verse 3 says, "And one called to another and said: 'Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of His glory!" Anytime in the Old Testament a word is repeated 3 times, it means unlimited, infinite, without end. So, the angels were singing to an infinitely Holy God.

So, we know that we have a need for Christian education so that we can continue to teach our students that God is sovereign (no matter what happens He ordained it in our lives for our good), God

is powerful, and God is holy, holy, holy. Isn't that amazing. In the last verse of the chapter, it talks about the tenth. This is meaning that there is always God's chosen people placed in a land. We have a reason to celebrate and continue Christian education to help teach the tenth to reach a lost and dying world.

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3rd & 4th Grade




