This school was not like any other original school; this one taught the dignity of labor as well as book education. He became famous when he delivered a speech for the opening of the Atlanta Exposition, talking about racial differences between the blacks and the whites. God led Booker to do everything in his life. We just finished this book! A quote from Booker states that "The happiest people are those who do the most for others." (p.32) We decided to set out a compliment box for the whole school to put in compliments for others. Hebrews 13:16 says, "Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God." LEGACY OF GRACE

What is the need?

For most school budgets, the salary and the benefits of staff comprise 80% of the total budget. However, staff at the Christian school earn 16-17% less on average than their local public school counterparts.

Where are we at?

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It would take a significant tuition increase in addition to ESA funds to close the current salary & benefits gap. Maintaining fiscal responsibility, slow and steady tuition increases, and fair compensation to teachers is the current goal.

Where are we going?

We are entering into a new age of Christian Education in Iowa that is very exciting! Thanks to the ESA bill that was passed, schools are able to charge closer to what the cost of education is and at the same time compensate teachers and staff fairly in both salary & benefits. The goal is to move staff compensation closer to 90% of their comparable public school colleagues.
