LOG-STO

One of the means for us to bless families to have access to a quality Christian education is through the Legacy of Grace School Tuition Organization (LOG-STO). This state program allows for individuals and businesses to donate money to help families with tuition at a private school, receiving a 75% state tax credit of the donation, which reduces your state tax liability.

Our LOG-STO has been allocated to collect \$559,683.00 this year to help families who are not currently eligible for a State of Iowa Education Savings Account. For example, our PreKindergarten students are not eligible because they attend fewer days. A donation of any size would help us to move closer to our goal. 
CHRISTMAS PROJECT

Many of these residents came back to collapsed or severely damaged homes. Rock Valley Christian had 3 feet of water throughout their entire building and even more in their bus barn. God has been so faithful and they were able to start school only a week later than originally planned, but they still have outstanding needs that need to be met. Peoria Christian will be working to help bridge the gap by raising funds to help replace student desks. Students, parents, and society members are encouraged to bring their loose change to school between November 25 and December 13.
