## Principal's Message

#### Love

Because of Valentine's Day, we normally think of love during the month of Feburary. Since February is the second month of the year, you might even see gifts at the stores for Valentine's Day as soon as Christmas is over. You might think of flowers, teddy bears, chocolates, and it is amazing to see the amount of people (especially men) at the store the night before Valentine's Day, with the goal of trying to get that special gift, which says I love you.

All those items are fine, but what does the Bible say about love and what do we try to teach our students about love here at Peoria Christian school? That is what we should be focusing on during the month of February and the rest of the year. The Bible is full of verses on love. In fact, the Bible says God is love (I John 4:8). Most people would probably turn to I Corinthians chapter 13 (the love chapter) to read about love. However, the late R.C. Sproul once said, "I Corinthians chapter 13 is probably the most read chapter of the Bible but also the most misunderstood chapter of the Bible." The point that I think he was trying to make is that this chapter talks about God's amazing love but also reveals our sinful nature.

Let's take a quick look at chapter 13 and what we strive to teach our children here at Peoria Christian School. We see from the first 3 verses that when we try using our gifts that God has given to us without love, we gain nothing. In verses 4-8a, we see characteristics of God's love: patient, kind, does not boast, not arrogant, not resentful, does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices with the truth, and love bears all, believes all, hopes all, and endures all things, and never ends. Even as I am writing this, I can see my own shortcomings and why we teach these items to our students. We emphasize to our children that when we reflect God's love to others that we need to put others ahead of ourselves. In our sinful nature, we don't naturally put others first, but we strive to teach a love that reflects His love to one another.


