and determine feasibility for holding school independent of other area organizations and institutions, with student/staff safety remaining our top priority.


- Several board members are planning to attend a board workshop in Des Moines early next year.

Iowa's STO Program supports more than 11,000 students each year and is designed to help the parents whose choice in education is restricted by their income or zip code.


In Iowa, the state limits the amount of tax credits available to donors. The lower the limit – the less is available to help students.
